Dear Parishioners,

The great celebrations of All Saints and All Souls draws into sharp focus the nature of the Catholic Church. First, she is a human institution of divine origin. The Church draws her humanity from each and every one of us, men and women seeking their God. The Church's divinity stems from the same God Who, in Jesus Christ, shed His blood for her. Moreover, the Church is unlike any earthly society as the salvation of souls is her singular preoccupation. The Gospel, the Sacraments, and Christian charity, all point to the blessedness God has prepared for those who love Him. Our membership in this Church, this great communion, begins in the waters of baptism. All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day remind us that said membership extends well past the sleep of death.

All Saints' Day (Nov. 1st) highlights the truth that "we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses." (Heb. 12: 1-2) They are those men and women, known and unknown, from every time and place who professed Christ Jesus as Lord, by their words and deeds and sometimes the shedding of their blood. The Church on earth holds them up as models of Christian life and piety. If one looks around Saint Clare or any other Catholic parish one would see the saints enshrined in marble, wood, and stained glass forever fixed in holy and pious poses, seemingly above this world's problems. Never forget the saints inhabited this fallen world, they too had their doubts, crises, and shortcomings. Saint Augustine of Hippo, the fornicator turned bishop, once remarked, "Every saint has a past, every sinner a future." They are celebrated for having remained faithful to the very end. Furthermore, the saints are venerated---not worshipped---as they point us to the Savior, not themselves. They being the Church in heaven intercede for us in the great hope that we may one day know the joy they possess in eternity.

All Souls' Day (Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>) points to the certainty of the grave. All of us must say goodbye to family, friends, and loved ones as we transition to the next life. This separation from all that is familiar, worldly, is certainly bewildering. More so, we are judged at the moment of death, God repaying to each one according to their deeds in life. The Apostle John proclaimed, "nothing unclean will enter Heaven" (Rev. 21: 27). The Church believes that souls not lost to hell, but not ready for Paradise undergo the cleansing fire of purgatory. We, on this side of time, owe those souls the charity of our prayers.

To pray for the dead is not pagan superstition, but a godly practice. Judas, an Israelite commander, grieved his fallen brothers in arms, "thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin." (2 Macc 12: 45) You and I know that our earthly pilgrimage is a long and arduous one. God Almighty forbid, a few will leave this world with unrepentance and infidelity heavy on our hearts. The prayers of the Church on earth assists those suffering souls who long for heaven. In the final analysis, all Christian souls, saints and sinners, living and dead, alike must answer the great question, once asked of Simon Peter, "Do you love me?" (Jn 21: 16)

Blessed Mary, and all the Saints, pray for us! Eternal rest, grant onto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them!
