Dear Parishioners,

Our secular culture does not provide us with much of a lead time from Thanksgiving to Christmas. It's as if before the turkey is carved, we are already decking the halls with boughs of holly. Thus, the Church, in her wisdom, gives us to the four weeks of Advent to ease into the celebration of Jesus' birth.

Advent gives us certain visual and audio cues. Notice how our sacristans have exchanged the "green"-ery of Ordinary Time, symbolizing growth and change for the violet of the present season, representing quiet hopeful expectation. In addition, our Advent wreath with its four candles---three violet, one rose, lit one at time, week by week---call to mind that our mortal pilgrimage takes place against the backdrop of eternity, hence the wreath's ring shape. In ages past, Advent was just as penitential as Lent. While presently the Church does not prescribe days of fasting and abstinence for this season, she asks that we refrain from singing the Gloria until Christmas. * The rationale being that great canticle was first sung by the angels to alert the shepherds to the Savior's birth (Lk 2: 14). While we do retain the Alleluia at Mass, at Saint Clare for the prayer of the faithful we will either say or sing, "Marantha, Come O Christ the Lord." The word "marantha" (1 Cor. 16:22) stems from Aramaic, again meaning, "Come, Lord!" This expression in relation to Advent has a double meaning as we, await Christ's first arrival in history as a babe in the arms of Blessed Mary, and again at the end of all time when He will judge the living and the dead.

Our Advent observance, this year, will be a special one. We will have Vespers and Benediction, at 3: 30 PM, this Sunday, December 3rd, and next Sunday, December 10th. Deacon Joseph 'Joe' Dass, a key organizer of the annual Guyana Mass, will preach on the 3rd, while Father Richard "Rick" Riccioli, OFM Conv., the pastor of Holy Trinity-St. Mary Church, Brooklyn, will preach on the 10th. We welcome world-renowned revivalist Father Trevor Nathasingh to Saint Clare Church from December 11th to 13th. The doors open each night at 6: 30 PM. For more information, please consult the flyer in this weekend's bulletin. At last, but not least we will Lessons and Carols on Sunday, December 17, 5: 30 PM. Michael Zephyrine, our music director, along with the choir are hard at work rehearsing the various anthems, hymns, and carols of Advent and Christmas for the occasion. Monsignor Sean Ogle, the diocesan Vicar for Clergy and Consecrated Life, will be the guest preacher. During the service we will having the blessing and lighting of the parish Christmas tree and lights. Lastly, on Monday, December 18th, the Archdiocese of New York and the Diocese of Brooklyn will observe Reconciliation Monday. Priests will be available in every parish church throughout the five boroughs and upstate counties to hear the confessions of the faithful. At Saint Clare, Fr. John and I will hear confessions after the 8: 30 AM Mass as well as at a special 6 PM Penance Service.

The praying and the praising of Advent will prepare us for the great joy of Christmas.
