# Dear Parishioners,

Merry Christmas! Happy New Year! It is my hope that each of you spent the holidays with those you love the most in this world. I, along with the clergy of the parish, enjoyed celebrating the special Masses that mark this time of the year. Christmas reminds us that God deigned to save the world through one like us in all things but sin, His Son Jesus Christ born of the Virgin Mary. New Year, though secular in observance, teaches us that our earthly pilgrimage is still unfolding and each of us is here on borrowed time. Yet, we trust in loving purposes of God, though His plan is far too mysterious for our minds to comprehend. Nevertheless, I am embracing 2024 with open arms and open eyes.

It is in the spirit of that newfound courage I would like to finally address a very pressing matter. Last November, Bishop Brennan wrote a very sobering letter to every Roman Catholic parish in Brooklyn and Queens. If you have not seen nor read the letter hard copies will be made available next week in the back of church. Our shepherd laid bare some troubling figures. The attendance of the faithful at Holy Mass has dropped some 40 percent in the last five years! Moreover, we have more priests retiring and/ or dying than we have seminarians to replenish the clerical ranks! In short, we can not continue with business as usual, something has got to give.

Allow me to bring this home. I am told that prior to my arrival as administrator, in the summer of 2020, our Masses use to be standing room only. Along with the people came the monies to help with our operational costs. And yes, I understand that was pre-pandemic. I can say presently post-pandemic Saint Clare has not returned to her former glory. The 8 AM and 10: 30 AM Sunday Masses are our best attended liturgies often boasting some 100+ parishioners. The 5 PM (Saturday) and 12: 30 PM Masses are our least attended, both rarely break the mid-60s mark. On average, Father John and I see about 300 people between the four Masses. Furthermore, Saint Clare nets any where from between an estimated \$2, 000 to \$4,000 in weekly collections. If our parish survived on this alone, I would have had to make some deep cuts to spending and personnel. What is keeping us afloat are rental incomes from the school annex, the former convent, and the leasing of our bell tower as a cellular communications antenna. Yet, still Saint Clare is financially stressed as in the last three years we have had to address significant financial liabilities as well as repair to critical infrastructure. I am in conversation with the Diocese of Brooklyn about next steps. That being said, we are NOT at risk of closing.

I write all this as we now embark on our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. First and foremost, Saint Clare's best days are not behind her, but ahead of her. As the 13<sup>th</sup> pastor I am duty-bound to leave this church better than I found when Father Andy, Lord rest him, handed the reins to me. However, I cannot do this alone. In the days and weeks ahead, I will either convene or convoke extraordinary meetings of parish clergy and staff, the parish council, the finance council, as well as ministries and societies to ask three simple questions: I. Where were we 'yesterday,' 2. where are we today?, and 3. where are we going tomorrow? I may, in the spirit of Pope Francis' synod convene a town hall to ask rank and file parishioners those very same questions and here your responses. Or if such a public forum is too daunting, I will accept written and signed electronic (or physical) correspondence and address parishioner concerns on a one-on-one basis in a private meeting. The only rule to these important deliberations is Christian charity, every priest, deacon, staffer, volunteer, and parishioner is owed the right to their good name, reputation, and character; this will not be the settling of old scores or past hurts.

In the meanwhile, what are some practical, concrete steps we can take as a parish community now. First and foremost, pray for parish clergy and staff, including yours truly. We work tirelessly to ensure that this church is truly a place where all can come and encounter the Living Christ. Second, as per our bishop's plea, pray for an increase of vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life "for the harvest is great, but the laborers are few." (Mt. 9: 37-38) Third, continue to tithe, and if you have not yet made a (or paid your) pledge to the Annual Catholic Appeal please do so. As of today, we are \$10,000 short of our \$ 55,051 goal. Fourth, reach out to fallen away parishioners who have not returned since the pandemic. A phone call or a cup of coffee may go a long away on bringing some of

our neighbors back to the regular practice of their Catholic Christian faith. Fifth, please support First Friday, Vespers and Benediction, Faith Formation, Youth Ministry, and the like with your time and presence. Our Catholic Christian faith begins with the Mass, but it does not end there. And lastly, anything that is done for our beloved Saint Clare is not for our own honor and glory, but that of Almighty God, please remember that. We have supporting us a century long legacy of faith and service. Saint Clare, pray for us!


