Dear Families,

I hope all is well! Since the parish closed in March 2020 due to Covid-19, Our Diocese has been leading us through this time of uncertainty to continue to support you in your efforts to collaborate with us as we continue to provide Faith Formation for you and your family. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, reminds us in his new *General Directory for Catechesis* that those being catechized can live their life in a simple and spontaneous way. We are called to accompany each other on a journey toward Christ, taking the lead for their children.

Given the uncertainty of the times, a **blended learning model for Faith Formation** has been approved by the Diocese of Brooklyn and is the **recommended** format moving forward. This model allows Faith Formation to be done in both an in-class or at-home setting depending on the circumstances. It also addresses the fact that the parent/guardian is the primary educator and formator of their children in the Faith.

AT HOME-In most cases, the at home distance learning sessions will begin with the catechist addressing the student and the parent(s)/guardian(s) for approximately 20 minutes using GOTOMEETING, TEAMS, etc. The student will complete his/her assignment using the e-book during the week. Parents or guardians should be available during the week to assist the child if he/she needs assistance. All will reconvene the following week at the appropriate time using the link to connect.

IN CLASSROOMS-Using this model, the student will learn the material at home and discuss it when and if the group session meets in person. The group session meeting times may be different from the times the session meets for distance learning. Sessions may not meet every week, depending on the schedule. Information will be sent to you regarding the new policies for in session gatherings (masks, social distancing, etc.).

ST. CLARE OF ASSISI

St. Clare of Assisi was the first woman to practice the life of entire poverty as taught by St. Francis. Placed by him at the head of a few companions in the small convent of San Damiano, she governed her community for forty-two years thus founding at the gates of Assisi the Order of Poor Clares.

Their Rule included austerities hitherto unknown in monasteries of women. They went barefoot, slept on the ground, kept perpetual abstinence and made poverty the basis of their lives. St. Clare died on August 11, 1253, and was canonized two years after her death



The Feast Day of St. Clare will be celebrated at 11:00am on the 9th of August 2020, followed by a procession around the block with the St. Clare statue.
